All five of the form letters can be found under the Forms and Publications section for easily getting the program going.

There are the consent letter for the parents to sign, an explanation of how the SPOT works and what vision problems could be detected. This is a great tool to present to those unfamiliar with the SPOT.

There is a PASS letter and a REFERRAL letter with screening results to send home.

# Think B4U Move: 1VDG Lion Homer Cook

Lions' year 22/23 is off and Roaring. DG Helen has let everyone know we need to work together by her slogan Find your Gear, which dovetails with International President Brian Sheehan's slogan of Together We Can.

How do we, as Lions, support each other? What is the best way to get our message out in your community?

Letting others see what we do as Lions may be just that simple: Be together in service and be sure to let people know you are Lions! Wear your Lions tee-shirt. Put up a sign or banner to let people know the XYZ Lions Club is on the job. Your club may not have a member who is a technology whiz. Do you know who can help? Your local high school, community college, or other institute of higher learning. Many schools require their students to perform community service. Why not help the local Lions Club be seen online through social media? Whatever you do, think twice about doing something flashy that you can't keep going if you lose your technology help.

This Lion wants to do things which demonstrate to others that we are ready to serve. Have you considered something like playing chess at the juvenile facility or youth organization? I did that two years ago when Norfolk Superintendent Lion John Bell invited me to join Chess Nutz, the group that plays chess with residents of the detention facilities, as well as the Boys and Girls Club. The program is called "Think B4U Move". It helps drive home the point that the kids need to think about the things they're presented with before making a decision that could have a bad result for them. One of the people I came to know is Don Roberts of WAVY10 television in Hampton Roads.

Early in August, Don contacted me about putting together a 30-second video of a chess tournament at the Boys and Girls Club. I was excited. Who knows what this can turn into?

A few weeks ago, Don recorded a Zoom interview. Since it was on Zoom, I changed my background to showcase the large Sight and Hearing Van and really drive home the fact I was there as a Lion. EVMS Lions Club is mostly composed of 2nd and 3rd year medical students who move into residency before entering clinical practice prior to graduation. They perform eye screenings in schools, at public fairs, participates in Project Homeless Connect, and assist migrant workers on

the Eastern Shore. In addition, they take pressures and assist their professors (also EVMS Lions) with eye exams, as well as the HOPES clinic, a monthly health clinic helping the indigent.
